So what exactly is a deacon? And what will Carter do while he is here?

Some of you may know the answers to these questions, some may not! But in order to get us all off to a good start, I thought it might be useful for us to review just what a deacon is.

In the Episcopal Church, there are three orders of ordained ministry: bishops, priests, and deacons. Each group has specific duties, authority, and roles, with some overlap between them. When an individual feels a call to ordained ministry, one of the initial acts of discernment is to discover

whether one feels called to be a priest or a deacon. For me, it was clear from the beginning that I was called to be a priest: I was to preside at the table, preach and teach the Gospel, care for God's people, and work with lay leaders to administer the church's work. For deacons—those called to be "vocational," or permanent deacons, it is quite different. They most often have outside employment, and serve the church in an unpaid role, working to model servanthood to the church and to the world in a positive way. In the Catechism on page 856 of The Book of Common Prayer, the ministry of a deacon is defined as "...to represent Christ and his Church, particularly as a servant of those in need; and to assist bishops and priests in the proclamation of the Gospel and the administration of the sacraments." Deacons may preach, and their role in the Eucharist is to read the gospel, set the table, assist at communion and give the dismissal. They serve under the bishop, and so are placed into a church under his or her direction.

Carter went through the discernment process at Eastern Shore Chapel and at the diocesan level, and a call to the diaconate was affirmed. As a result he has been attending Deacon's School while also working fulltime and trying to have a life with his wife, children and grandchildren! His placement at Emmanuel will be for the next year (ending June 30, 2018), and he has certain requirements to fulfill while he is here. Since he is not yet ordained, he will not be fully functioning as a deacon, but he will preach, set the table at the Eucharist, lead some formation classes and work with outreach. How can you help him? By welcoming him to Emmanuel, supporting him in his ministry, and giving him useful feedback on his work here. (Not simply "I liked your sermon," but "I liked your sermon because...") In this way we'll help him to become a confident, well-rounded deacon of the church. So be sure to introduce yourself to Carter, and if you have any questions feel free to ask him or me!



Vestry Commission Reports Next Vestry Meeting - August 15, 2017

Building and Grounds The Building and Grounds Commission is waiting for the final estimate for the upgrades to our security systems. We will have a new lawn maintenance service starting in July. We would like to thank Greg Goodman for all the time and effort he put into replacing our old light fixtures with new LED's, you should have noticed how much brighter the hallways, kitchen, and offices are with the new lights. All of the rain we have had lately has delayed the repairs to the headstones. Norfolk Monuments has told us that they hoped to have them completed in the next couple of weeks. Erin Sutton is working with the city to have an "Episcopal Church Welcomes You" sign installed at the intersection of Witchduck Rd. and Singleton Way. Jon Osborn is working on a plan for a Labyrinth (on the Green) we will have more on the size and location next month.

Communications No report

Day School. The Day School Commission met on Tuesday, June 6th. Enrollment is continuing to increase. We are not quite where we were last year at this time, but in good faith, we will continue to advertise. Karen Kearse has several advertisements on social media and we have been getting more phone calls about tours. We are very excited to welcome our new teachers for the upcoming school year. Many of them will be working with our students at our day camps this summer. We had to say goodbye to our beloved group member, Anne Pontius who is moving to California. We are, however, pleased to welcome Ashley Bohm to our commission!! We will not be meeting in the month of July but will pick up where we left off on Tuesday, August 1st.

Finance Our May receipts continued to show a healthy balance of revenues over expenses. However, partly because of Memorial Day weekend, and partly because of there being only four, rather than five, Sundays in May, the shortfall of year-to-date revenue to budget increased from a very modest \$1,345.57 to \$8,280.74. Other items in the financial statements are generally on track. Of concern to the Finance Commission, there are still 77 pledges who are behind for the year and we urge that they bring their pledges up to date before it becomes more difficult to do so. We anticipate some fall-off in revenue during the summer, and urge all who can to continue their support for Emmanuel.
